# Noye's Fludde

#### An opera by Benjamin Britten

**Noye's Fludde**, Britten's most complex work for children, was completed in 1957 and first performed during the 1958 Aldeburgh Festival. It is based on the Chester Miracle Play of *Noyes Fludde*, the account of Noah and the Ark from Genesis: chs. 6 and 7.

Miracle plays, mediaeval dramatisations of Bible stories, were performed by town Guilds of local people with music sung by choristers from the church or Cathedral. Each Guild performed one play from the cycle on an open cart called a Pageant, which moved around the town from place to place performing a different play each time until the cycle was complete. The scenic devices, though carefully worked out, were extremely simple. Several cities had their own versions of the stories, though many have not survived at all or are incomplete.

Noyes Fludde was written in such a way as to combine professional and amateur performers, the music often tailored to take account of the abilities of less accomplished players but with no sense of compromise or writing down. Apart from Noah himself, Mrs. Noah and the (spoken) Voice of God, the main vocal parts are written for children, and the orchestral forces comprise strings, recorders, bugles, handbells and an assortment of percussion, including improvised instruments made from sandpaper blocks and a line of mugs. The congregation is included as well: they are invited to join in the singing of three hymn arrangements, (and to encourage their participation these hymns are printed in this programme - please see page 8).

## Synopsis

All, including audience, sing the hymn, *Lord Jesus*, *Think on Me*. (See p. 8 for words and music.)

God has decided to destroy the world with a great flood, but has asked Noah and his family to build a boat - the Ark - to ensure their survival. As Noah and his children set to work, his wife and her gossips (friends) look on laughingly, and she refuses to join him on the Ark. God then tells Noah to save all the animals by taking two of each kind on board with him, and they all come in. Mrs. Noah still refuses to leave her gossips; her sons eventually force her into the Ark just as a huge wave sweeps away all the gossips.

All sing Eternal Father, Strong to Save: audience join in verses 2 and 3.

The storm subsides after forty days and nights. Noah sends out a raven, followed by a dove. The dove returns with an olive branch, a sign of dry land and a harbinger of peace. Once God has told Noah that it is safe to leave the Ark, all rejoice; God sends a rainbow as a promise of hope and peace.

All sing The Spacious Firmament on High: audience join in verses 5 and 6.



### **Biographies**


Bruce Graham (the Voice of God) graduated from Edinburgh university. In 1978 he joined the D'Oyly Carte Opera Company, playing many Gilbert and Sullivan character roles. Since then, Bruce has appeared with the national opera companies, Opera della Luna, the Buxton G&S Festival and University College Opera, and in concerts, repertory seasons and tours in the UK and abroad. He has appeared in eight West End musicals, including *Me and My Girl*, *Follies*, *Phantom of the Opera*, *Sunset Boulevard* and *Cats*; he has also had the honour of appearing in a Royal Variety Command Performance. Bruce's work includes film, TV, Old Time Music Hall and pantomime, and he has appeared all over the world as a principal with the Carl Rosa Company. On a previous occasion Bruce sang the role of Noah in *Noyes Fludde*, and he is delighted that he has at last merited promotion to the Voice of God!

Roger Bloomfield (Noah) sang as a choirboy, with the London Symphony Chorus and other groups, whilst becoming an architect; then studied at the GSMD with Rudolf Piernay. His first experience of opera came when, as a student with Malmfrid Sand, he was cast in *I Pagliacci*. The rest is history. Roger has sung for many years at St. Augustine's Church in Kilburn and currently with the Queen's Park Singers. He and Malmfrid now sing at St. Mark's Church, the venue for tonight's performance.

Malmfrid Sand (Mrs.Noah) came to London from Norway on a Government Singing Scholarship and later attended the National Opera Studio as a lyric-dramatic soprano. She has for many years worked principally in Europe and the USA, performing in a wide range of concert and opera. Through a combination of coincidences she became both teacher and conductor, first at the Festivale de Jeune Théatre de Pontlevoy in 2005, then with various groups and choirs in London, and found the work exciting, inspiring and rewarding. She is now permanently attached to St.Augustine's C of E High School as vocal coach and leader of the choir. As a lover of Britten's music, she is delighted to add the role of Mrs. Noah to those of Ellen Orford in *Peter Grimes*, Lady Billows in *Albert Herring* and, her first venture, as Miss Wordsworth in a student production of *Albert Herring* with a certain Roger Bloomfield as Superintendent Budd.

Mary Phillips (Conductor) played the clarinet in the National Youth Orchestra before reading music at the University of York. After acting with various theatre companies such as Soapbox Theatre and Lumière and Son, she continued further singing study with Corinne Shirman-Sarti. Mary has written music for BBC and Thames Television companies, film (Derek Jarman's *Caravaggio*) and theatre. She has sung for many years with the BBC Singers and many other vocal groups such as the Electric Voice Theatre, Britten Sinfonia and Opera Rara as well as solo in oratorio and in recitals at home and abroad. She has sung on many film score recordings including Baz Luhrmann's *Romeo and Juliet* and *Moulin Rouge*. She is currently teaching at Trevor-Roberts School, South Hampstead Junior and High Schools and directs the Queen's Park Junior Singers.

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
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
